Dear Chancellor, Honorable Chief Justice Owiny Dollo, Mr. Alwi Hassan, our Guest speaker, Board of Trustees, University Council, University Senate, Staff members, family and friends of the graduates and dear graduands:

The theme of today's graduation is "Covid-19 and the Rise of Virtual Communities: Ideas for a new era."

This graduation ceremony fits the theme of today's graduation because it is being conducted by a virtual community and our graduands are participating and graduating virtually. They are participating from all the corners of Uganda, Tanzania, South Sudan, Somalia, Eritrea, DRC, Nigeria, Rwanda and many other countries.

I will talk about social and economic disruption and ideas for this new era. The most concrete and immediate example of the disruption that I am talking about is this graduation itself. Our normal face-to-face graduation has been disrupted. How have we responded? We have responded with a new idea for a new era, and that idea is to use technology to conduct a "scientific and virtual graduation." This type of graduation has never happened in human history anywhere in the world before this year. This year IUEA is doing what most universities in all the continents of the world are doing

which is to hold a virtual graduation because the Covid-19 pandemic does not allow all the hundreds of our graduands and their families to gather in one place.

We have been disrupted, but we have responded with a solution of holding a virtual graduation. Likewise, many companies and businesses have been disrupted worldwide and forced to re-organize their employees to work from home. In fact, the English dictionary now has a new acronym WFH which means "work from home." Several other words have quickly come into all languages. These include words that refer to video-conferencing companies such as Google-Meet and Zoom. "I will be joining a Zoom at 2pm" is a new phrase in English that is nowadays understood by many people to mean that I will be joining a virtual meeting by video-conferencing.

Zoom is a company that enables virtual communities of workers to hold meetings and discussions online using advanced video-conferencing technologies that work across several platforms including computers and smartphones. Zoom was disrupted upwards—it was disrupted from being a small company that almost no one outside of technology experts had heard about just last year, to now being one of the world's biggest companies. Here is what the famous BBC said about Zoom in April this year:

"[the] use of Zoom's software jumped 30-fold in April, as the coronavirus pandemic forced millions to work, learn and socialise remotely... At its peak, the firm counted more than 300 million daily participants in virtual meetings, while paying customers have more than tripled...The dramatic uptake has the potential to change the firm's path. When Zoom sold its first shares to the public last year, it was valued at \$15.9bn. That shot to more than \$58bn on Tuesday. What Zoom has done is kind of democratised video conferencing for all kinds of businesses and made it very simple for everyone from yoga instructors through to board room executives to deploy video." I end the quote.

Covid-19 has disrupted companies and businesses. This disruption has already killed some businesses and put some in intensive care with a risk of dying unless they come up with new ideas for survival. But it has also disrupted some companies like Zoom upwards, that, is taken those companies that were already prepared either to work like virtual communities, or to enable virtual communities to work remotely, to become rapidly more successful.

More than a century ago, the French scientist Luis Pasteur said that "luck favours the prepared mind." Using Luis Pasteur's insight, I will say that for companies like Zoom that had already "prepared" tools for enabling virtual communities to engage and to work remotely, the disruption of Covid-19 became a kind of luck that has enabled them to out-compete other companies and to become extremely successful.

Even before Covid-19 disrupted the whole world, technology had already disrupted many types of businesses that were slow to adapt. One well-known example is what happened to cabs or private-taxis worldwide when Uber and Bolt and other digital-cabs or digital-taxis arrived on the scene. Many private-taxi companies in many cities of the world went out of business because they were not prepared to digitize or create digital apps.

In the world of education today, any university or tertiary institution that fails to embrace online digital technologies for teaching and learning is likely to die. Covid-19 has disrupted education and forced all institutions to wake up to the reality of the power of ICT and the internet. The pool of lecturers and students is no longer local, it is now global. And, therefore, the competition for lecturers and students is no longer local, it is global. You can sit anywhere in the world and join a virtual classroom that is physically located in Uganda or England or Australia, or some other country thousands of Kilometres away.

For another example, let us look at offices for rent in many cities worldwide. Many companies responded to the Covid-19 lockdown by cancelling their leases for office spaces because there was no reason to pay for an office that you are not using. The landlords for these offices have to come up with new ideas or perish. Some of the

new ideas have been to convert these offices into shared work-spaces or flexible-offices that allow for daily renting by various individuals and companies, instead of the traditional annual renting by a single company or business. Another example is restaurants worldwide. Many restaurants have closed permanently. But a few restaurants have responded by switching to effective food delivery to people in their homes and offices.

The impact of Covid-19 on the economy is total and permanent. It is now up to us to adapt or to perish. All businesses will have to reconfigure and reinvent themselves.

And individual employees will have to re-skill and up-skill and increase their capacities for working remotely in a digital world. Even half-literate private-taxi drivers will have to learn how to use digital apps or they will be forced out of employment.


The combination of digital apps, websites and mobile money payments has enabled agile companies with new ideas to provide services to their customers even during the lockdown and to thrive even as other companies perish. In summary, the impact of Covid-19 on the global economy has been generally catastrophic and disruptive. It is up to us to figure out how to survive and thrive in a world that continuous to be disrupted.

I am glad to see that IUEA is one of the few universities that have figured out how to survive and thrive.

#### Chief Justice Alphonse Owiny Dollo

ear Chancellor, our Guest speaker, Board of Trustees, University Council, Vice Chancellor, University Senate, staff members, family and friends of the graduates and dear Graduands:

This is a very unusual graduation. It is called a scientific virtual graduation. It is a graduation of the type that no one predicted only a year ago. It is a graduation of the "Fourth Industrial Revolution" that has been forced upon us by a very unusual and very unexpected force of nature in the form of a global infectious disease that spreads rapidly and kills many, and requires that in order for us to survive, we must behave differently.

This Covid-19 pandemic, which is also known as Corona, has changed the world of education forever. It has forced all countries to shut down their schools, colleges and universities for many months. And it has forced all educational systems worldwide to quickly accept online teaching and learning, and working from home as part of "the new normal."

Prior to this Covid-19 pandemic some highly developed countries had already built strong online educational platforms such as Coursera.org, Edx and Blackboard and were already delivering some, but not all, of their educational services online. This year all countries, including developing countries like Uganda, have been forced to fast-track all aspects of distance learning including online education

I commend the leadership of IUEA, from the Board of Trustees, University Council all the way to staff members for responding so quickly to build a new distance learning platform that has put the university in good stead for the future. I commend you students for taking up the challenge of finishing your studies online. Congratulations are in order to the National Council for Higher Education in Uganda for their brilliant response to this Covid-19 crisis and for granting IUEA the green light to conduct distance learning classes. The British statesman Winston Churchill is credited with having said at the end of the Second World War that one should "never let a good crisis go to waste." What Churchill meant is that as human beings we are creatures of habit and we do not easily change our habits or our cultures at all. We only change when we are forced to adapt. And it is crises of various kinds that force us to either adapt or perish. IUEA has adapted and has adapted well.

Permit me to enumerate a few instances in which IUEA has adapted well. For one, IUEA has built a distance learning platform for the virtual community of scholars, a new phenomenon. Two, in response to Covid-19, IUEA has introduced a new cyber service to Uganda called IUEA Cyber Warriors. I believe IUEA Cyber Warriors is being launched today. I congratulate IUEA for this guick thinking and quick pivot to opportunity. In addition, I will like to wish IUEA a very Happy 10th Anniversary! Such a young university and such accomplishments. It is a fitting testament to IUEA that it has been able to embrace the opportunities made possible by the creation of virtual communities.

Businesses that fail to adapt to what is now regarded as the new normal will perish. It

will be, as Charles Darwin observed in the 1800s, "survival for the fittest." In this particular day, it means survival for those institutions and businesses that are agile enough to rapidly adapt to the new normal that requires deploying the powerful internet-based technologies that are now part of the Fourth Industrial Revolution that we were slow to join before Covid-19 forced as to adapt or perish.

The First Industrial Revolution was based on water and steam power to mechanize production, and most of Africa missed this revolution. The Second Industrial Revolution was based on use of electricity to improve productivity, and most of rural Africa has not yet joined this 2nd revolution. The Third Industrial Revolution also known as the information revolution is based on computers and other digital devices, and most of Africa is still struggling to join this 3rd revolution. And the Fourth Industrial Revolution that has been thrust upon us by Covid-19 is thought of as a much more powerful, and faster, and cheaper, and dominant version of the Third Industrial Revolution. In this Fourth Industrial Revolution, competition is global and, therefore, all educational institutions and businesses that fail to adapt technology and to build cohesive and effective virtual communities will perish.

In order for universities to succeed in the new normal they must do the following seven things:

One, prepare academic content for online teaching and learning. Two, use technological devices and the internet for teaching online and offline. Three, empower their students to study actively online and offline. Four, conduct tests and examinations online. Five, join and collaborate with virtual communities worldwide. Six, develop new ethics and protocols for WFH or working from home and for collaborating in virtual communities. And seven, finally optimize the use of the powers of ICT and the Internet that we were always slow to deploy before Covid-19 forced us to either adapt or perish. Students in this new normal will have a


direct experience of learning and working with colleagues in a virtual community of teachers and learners. This experience will be excellent preparation for employment and entrepreneurship in the corporations and businesses of the new normal of the Fourth Industrial Revolution in which internet-based technologies and devices take centre-stage.

The fact that Covid-19 has forced educational institutions to embrace technology and to force all students to become comfortable working with technology is good news for businesses across Africa. This is because it is students from these educational institutions that become employees and entrepreneurs responsible for fighting for the success of African businesses in this new normal of global competition within a highly technological ecosystem.

Having spoken with the leadership of IUEA, I am delighted to report that IUEA was among the first few universities in Uganda to rapidly adapt to the new normal and to get approval from the National Council for Higher Education to continue teaching and learning in accordance with the ODeL guidelines. IUEA has become a powerful model for all universities in Africa.

# MESSAGE FROM THE GUEST SPEAKER'S SPEECH

Dear Chancellor, Honorable Chief Justice Owiny Dollo, Mr. Alwi Hassan, Board of Trustees, University Council, Vice Chancellor, University Senate, Staff members, family and friends of the graduates and dear graduands:

I consider it a great privilege to be invited to speak to you today. Under normal circumstances. I should tell you something profound that you will remember for the rest of your lives - and that you can tell your grandchildren. But in the year of a vicious pandemic, this is a herculean task. How can one compete with Covid-19, a global enigma that threw the world into a tailspin and has etched its lockdowns, social distancing and severe economic hardship into our collective memories? Years down the road when people think of the vear 2020, they think Covid-19, they think of lockdowns, and of social distancing and of hopelessness. My message to you today is, let this year be the year that when you think back, you think of Hope, of success. You can do this if you let the pandemic be a launching pad for your new invention using virtual communities as your opportunity. You will succeed if you see Covid-19 as a rocket that will propel you to greater heights, not as a virus that locks you down. If you think like this, you will remember 2020 as a year of Hope and Opportunity, not of lockdowns, social distancing and ioblessness.

Just a few months ago, the world was quite different. It looked predictable and stable. Finding a job was possible. Mingling with family and friends, shaking hands and congregating were normal, everyday activities. Today, they are not normal activities, they are health risks that may even kill. With spectacular suddenness, the world is upside down. An unwanted sea change of epic proportions is washing across continents, impacting everyone in its wake. You are both victims and beneficiaries of this disruptive change. School-

ing was upended, yet with creative technology – virtual technology – you finished your exams and are graduating. Most of you are graduating virtually, you are not physically present in east Africa, in Uganda, in Kampala nor at IUEA, yet you are participating in this joyous occasion in spite of Covid-19.

Today marks an important day in your lives, you are graduating. Congratulations to you and to your families. Traditionally graduation marks the beginning of a new journey, a new journey in all possible permutations: A new post bachelor's education journey and a new iourney into a post Covid-19 disruptive world. Disruptive Change is defined as "changes in market trends causing a shift in the mode of production to fit the customer demands." In a normal world, disruptive change is not easy, much less in a pandemic world. Moreover. Covid-19-induced disruptive change does not fit the normal definition: It is not a shift that affects a portion of an industry and it was not caused by market forces but by a virulent virus that does not fit customer demands

Nevertheless, "out of every dark cloud is a silver lining." Those who succeed look for the silver lining and ride on it. Your eminent university. IUEA is a perfect example of this. As the pandemic rages, your university, IUEA, came up with a solution that most, if not all companies can use, IUEA came up with a cyber security platform called Cyber Warriors. Cyber Warriors' objective is to protect the assets of companies in these tough times. The logic being with many skilled people out of work, they may try their luck on the valuable assets of companies. Secondly, as school lockdown continues. IUEA very rapidly built a distance learning platform to address the change that is sweeping the globe. Thanks to IUEA's agility, you are graduating today and continuing students and new students are able to continue their education in a virtual education environment, in defiance of Covid-19. I would like to ask you to please join me in applauding the Board of Trustees, the

University Council and members of IUEA for this vision and agility.

Before I proceed, I will also like to congratulate IUEA on its 10th anniversary. On 17th December 2020, IUEA will be 10 years old. In its 10 years of existence, the university has achieved a lot and has become one of the pre-eminent universities in Uganda. Today, the university is popularly known as "The Technological University of Choice." That moniker is well deserved. We are seeing one of the reasons it is so well respected today in the form of this graduation. Please join me in wishing IUEA a Happy Anniversary.

IUEA in its actions was ready for sudden change. You too must emulate your alma mater; You must be ready for change, whether gradual, planned or foisted on you. You must be ready for change not when you want to, but when it is necessary either due to an opportunity, misfortune or when a preferred course has run its course and you have reached the end of the road. As Peter F. Drucker, an economist and one of the great thinkers of the 20th century noted: "you cannot manage change, you must get ahead of it." IUEA got ahead of it. The company Zoom got ahead of it. Many other companies, old and new are getting ahead of change and are changing the narrative from lockdowns to towering opportunities. It is not easy but it is possible. How?

To get to this point was an important achievement in itself to which I commend you and the school for achieving, in spite of the disruption of school closure. As Steve Jobs, the co-founder of Apple Computers stated in a graduation speech in Stanford University in 2005, "You've got to find what you love.... If you haven't found it yet, keep looking. Don't settle..." Find what you love to do and think, how can I apply this to virtual communities?

The world you are stepping into is beset with great challenges and opportunities and the rise of virtual communities is an opportunity, and a lasting one, not a flash in a pan. In a recent article, the BBC reported that Microsoft, Facebook, Twitter and a myriad of companies have made remote work option (telecommuting, virtual office) permanent. Many companies, both in the first and developing world, are going virtual. The successful mind will look at Covid-19 as an opportunity to be the builders of a new world, a post pandemic world.





Let this continue to be your reflection point throughout your careers – that you must work hard to achieve your ambitions.




